The Progressives Young Leaders Summit as conceived by the office of the National Youth Leader will serve as an avenue for the All Progressives Congress, APC, to meet this need and both insert itself and take lead position in a conversation and agenda which undoubtedly represent the greatest concern of young people in the country today.

DISCUSSION TOPICS/SUB-THEMES

Are We The Turning Point Generation or Does Our Soro Soke End On Social Media?

As with young people in other parts of the globe, young Nigerians have demonstrated their desire for a seat at the table of leadership. This desire found an expression in the 'Soro Soke' mantra that rippled across the country and reflected the aspiration of young Nigerians to have their voices heard and their frustrations meaningfully addressed through dedicated policies and other institutional actions. Similar to preceding generations, the challenge before young Nigerians today is to find pathways for effective engagement and the elevation of their demands and desired changes beyond media talking points and trending topics on social media to the arena of power and leadership for transformative action. This panel will examine the political engagement strategies of young Nigerians, identify ways to achieve inclusion and equitable representation, and offer solutions on how to combine digital agitations with grassroots/on-the-ground organization for real and comprehensive change.

Agbado Economy: Leveraging Agribusiness for Economic Prosperity and Growth

Nigeria's bulging youth population has been identified as a potential national asset and essential ingredient of nation-building, particularly socio-economic development, if adequately harnessed. Young people need education, productive engagement, and opportunities for social mobility to be truly empowered and become drivers of positive growth. Agriculture is a globally acknowledged way of achieving this. Already Nigeria's largest employer of labour, the various opportunities available in the sector are central to the country's ambition to be self-sufficient and put its teeming youth population to work. Our candidate, H.E. Asiwaju Bola Ahmed Tinubu, emphasized this point while enunciating his plans to stimulate efficient production of local staples such as maize ('agbado' in the Yoruba language), rice, etc. and provide ready markets for local farmers. This panel will deliberate on the potential of agribusiness in Nigeria and ways to fully leverage the opportunities in the sector to facilitate economic prosperity and growth, particularly for young people.

2023 Election: Our Priorities for the Incoming Administration

Given their numeric strength and spread, young Nigerians are poised to determine the outcome of the 2023 General Elections. To emerge victorious, the contesting political parties must win their support and mobilize them to the polls. Achieving this will require a comprehensive understanding of their governance priorities and motivations, as well as generational aspirations in the face of a rapidly changing world. On this panel, eminent young Nigerians and progressives will be joined by our candidate, H.E. Asiwaju Bola Ahmed Tinubu, to discuss the youth agenda for 2023 and engage the standard-bearer on his plans to herald youth-led growth and place Nigeria on the path of sustainable growth and development.

Financing the Future: Supporting the Next Generation of Entrepreneurs

Young Nigerians have, over time, showcased their innovative abilities and capacity to generate bold ideas that push the frontiers of knowledge and development, and provide opportunities for social mobility to millions. This is evident in the fact that Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) responsible for 48% of Nigeria's GDP and 84% of employment are largely owned by young people leveraging the opportunities available in agriculture, technology, entertainment and other sectors of the economy to improve their social status and avail to themselves and other young people important platforms for creative expression and productive engagement. Missing in this

powerful mix that already contains talent and dedication is funding. Indeed, access to capital remains a notable obstacle for several young Nigerians, despite the government's best efforts. In light of declining revenue due in large part to oil's spiral and the wider, pandemic-induced economic downturn, there is clear need to identify and leverage alternative means of funding to fully maximize Nigeria's youth potential. On this panel, industry leaders and leading government economic policy makers will engage in a dialogue with notable young entrepreneurs on how to support and raise the next generation of youth entrepreneurs and business leaders who will power Nigeria's economic rise in a post-pandemic world.

The Crypto Craze: Threat or Opportunity?

Multiple market reports have placed Nigeria as the second largest cryptocurrency market on the African continent. Fueling this are young people drawn to the promises of decentralized blockchain technology and the potential for financial freedom. The decentralization, however, also has serious implications for monetary policy and the power of central banks to enforce necessary regulations. Balancing these concerns in the face of rising fintech innovations is a challenge for the present and the future. This panel will examine these issues and explore the consequences of the emergence of cryptocurrency and its widespread adoption, whether a threat or an opportunity.

Securing Nigeria: Young People as Critical Actors

Young people are at the heart of Nigeria's security challenges. Ensuring their positive societal integration and providing productive outlets for their energy and enthusiasm are critical to achieving lasting peace and development. This panel, featuring security experts and prominent young voices, will examine and highlight the role of young people in building and sustaining a culture of peace and collective security, in which disputes are amicably settled without resorting to violence and young people refrain from anti-social behavior and actions that fuel violence and insecurity.

Re-imagining Education: A Path to Sustainable and Effective Funding

Stakeholders and other critical actors in Nigeria's education sector agree that the major challenge besetting the sector is the absence of a sustainable funding model. Incessant strikes and other negative developments that have plagued the sector for decades are resultant factors of this challenge. On this panel are major stakeholders and innovators who will undertake to re-imagine education in the 21st century and explore possible ways of building a path to sustainable and effective funding.

How Do I Get Involved In the 2023 APC Election Campaign?

This panel will feature the leaders of the 2023 campaign of the All Progressives Congress (APC) who will highlight ways for young people to get involved in the campaign and contribute their unique talents and strengths to the joint mission of ensuring the victory and emergence of Asiwaju Bola Ahmed in 2023.

Female Power: Advancing Inclusion, Shattering the Ceiling.

Nigeria under the administration of President Muhammadu Buhari has made notable strides toward ensuring gender equity. As a nation with over 50% women population, many of whom determine the leadership of the country through high election participation, there is a clear need to ensure equitable representation in politics, leadership, and the economy. This panel will stage a serious conversation about the new media trends and effects of a 'no-editor' paradigm on a generation.

The Rising Female Power Forum: Realizing Your Power

This is a panel of young, emerging female leaders who will highlight ways through which women can realize their power, amplify their voices, and acquire deserved recognition and reward in all spheres of life. They will discuss several gendered issues in different sectors, including unique obstacles facing women and possible ways to scale them. They will highlight the life of a young woman in a world that has changed a lot in certain respects, but has remained starkly the same in others.

Understanding the Rise of Gen Z and Harnessing their Strengths

Over 25% of Nigeria's population belongs to Gen Z, i.e. Nigerians born between the years 1995 and 2010. They have displayed distinct characteristics that are often the subject of conversations and study. They value diversity, self-expression, and individuality. Their non-conformity and determination to re-write the rules oftentimes place them at odds with members of the older generation. But they are also uniquely talented and at the forefront of technological innovations and inventions changing the way we do things. This panel will stage an important discussion on how to understand the quirks and unique traits of the generation, as well as how to harness their strengths in building a strong and prosperous nation.

2015–2023: The Progressive Journey – How Far?

Nigerians agreed to undertake a journey with the APC in 2015 when a majority of voters terminated the 16-year reign of the opposition party and caused an historic power shift that propelled the progressives to power.
